Minutes of AGM 2010: The Chairman asked if there were any errors or omissions. There being none, it was moved by Pierre Doutre and seconded by Conrad Petrikowski that the Minutes be adopted as read. **Motion Carried.**

Annual Reports:

Vice-Chair: Minky welcomed all and apologized for missing so many meetings in 2011 due to work commitments. The Vice noted membership attendance was down and wondered if members wanted more social events and ruminated as to whether security entering the Dockyard was an issue. He wished all a Merry Christmas and good year in 2012.

Secretary: George stated that 2011 had been an interesting year with new members joining, trips to Groton Sub Vets for the Old Salts Pig Roast as well as

the on-going effort with the Submarine Museum project. Regular Monthly Meetings were also held "out of town" and at RCNA Peregrine. The Secretary also thanked members for attending and wished all a Merry Christmas and all the best for 2012.

He said this process could take some time to resolve and that he would keep the membership informed as events unfolded.

The Chair then invited Don (Buster) Brown, Immediate Past Chair to address the AGM with an update of the Museum. Buster went on to say there had been little progress. A meeting had been held of interested parties to plan the "Way ahead". Brian (Lapo) Lapierre would be photographing and cataloguing items for the display. Buster said there will be a Group meeting to be held in Jan 2012. Buster said all wishing to help were welcomed.

Chair: Terry expressed his regret for the 6 months or so he was away on the Left Coast with Victoria. He remarked on the two Top Student presentations presented in Halifax and one Top Student Award presented in Victoria. The chair stated the Executive was open to any and all suggestions to increase membership and would entertain ideas for meeting venues and social events. Terry also mentioned that the "Way Ahead" for the 2014 Centenary celebrations

would start in 2012.

The Chair then invited Cmdre Hickey to address the AGM. He commenced with a talk about the Canadian Submarine Centenary in 2014. Cmdre Hickey noted we face competition from Sea King 50th year celebration in 2013, 100th year of the War of 1812 celebration as well as the Commonwealth Games, Winter Olympics and FIFA. He went on to encourage the SAOC to offer ideas and to work with the Navy to make the Centenary a success. Cmdre Hickey mentioned the Navy were considering several options and investigating commemorative stamps and coins.

Cmdre Hickey spoke of HMCS Victoria's Workups and getting to sea after many years alongside. He also spoke of HMCS Windsor and the risk of her being delayed and he went on to say the goal was to have two boats running in 2012. He said the government would be holding the Navy's feet to the fire on this one especially in light of the W5 program with regards to the state of the Submarine Service of Canada.

Cmdre Hickey spoke on the Navy's restructuring with having a single Sub authority for both coasts. Cmdre Hickey closed his presentation with the news he was retiring in Jan 2012 but that he would remain active in the submarine community. The Chair thanked Cmdre Hickey for his presentation and the membership showed their appreciation with a round of applause.

Old Business: There was no Old Business.

New Business: The Secretary updated the AGM on the state of Ojibwa and the attempts to get her to Ontario in 2012. He mentioned e-mails and Face Book pages from the Ojibwa Project and that Rick Morgan would keep the SAOC informed as events developed.
