Minutes of the Monthly Meeting Wednesday 28 February 2018 MOG5 HQ JR Mess

<u>Correspondence</u>: Several Cheques and E-Transfers were received for dues. The Membership Chairman has updated the Master List to reflect the money received. The money will be given to the Treasurer when he returns from vacation. The Chairman still needs to write a formal letter thanking MS Charlesworth for giving us the tour of Tribute Tower in October and a copy will be sent to her supervisor.

<u>Minutes</u>: The 31 January 2018 Minutes were distributed via email and some hard copies available at the meeting for review. <u>Vice Chair</u>: Jim Northrup reported that he had contact with somebody from the Naval Museum of Halifax in CFB Stadacona regarding the artifacts located in the basement. Jim is going to follow this up and see if a new approach by the museum has taken place with respect to doing something with the items. Brian Lapierre stated that he inventoried all the artifacts in the room in 2013 and has pictures of all the articles.

<u>Treasurer</u>: Ron Cooper submitted a detailed financial report for 28 February 2018. The closing bank balance is now \$11,245.02 after expenses paid for Slop Invoices. The email was passed to the Chairman and Vice Chairman to try and make contact.
