Battle of the Atlantic Sunday as stated before Jim Northrup will represent SAOC and with Buster Brown place the SAOC wreath at the Cenotaph. Cliff Boettcher will get the wreath from the Somme Legion with the SAOC ribbon. Brian Lapierre informed us on the march back from the BAO Cenotaph the parade will stop at the Bonaventure Anchor Monument to lay wreaths. This is to recognize all the RCN and RCAF personnel who have passed away in peacetime and their bodies were never recovered. The work on the anchor should be finished on the 27th of April. There will be a small ceremony at 1600 on the 27th to thank the Air Force Engineers who took on this project. Bonaventure Anchor Monument has been in Point Pleasant Park since 1973 to commemorate those lost at sea in peacetime. The rededication of the Monument will happen on the 23rd Oct 2019 for the 50th anniversary of the explosion on HMCS Kootenay where 9 sailors were lost.

The Somme & Centennial Legions will have their own ceremonies for Battle of the Atlantic Sunday as well.

RCNA Peregrine will also be holding an event after the ceremonies at 1300.

HMCS Halifax as well will proceed to the area near Point Pleasant Park to spread the ashes of our fallen comrade Pierre Doutre. Pierre's son Gerald is the Coxn onboard the Halifax.
