<u>Naval Museum Submarine Room Update</u> Brian Lapierre informed us that they are making progress at the Submarine room display in Stad. Brian has posted pictures on several websites such as Facebook on the progress made. They are a year into the project and things are going very slowly. The bunk space and mess area are about 95% complete. They have received the graphic panels final design and corrections from NSCC

and the Director is preparing them for quote to be produced by contract. The proposed formal opening by the Base Commander will be on the Tuesday 30th July. An official invitation will be sent to all SAOC E members inviting them to attend. Invitations etc. are being handled by the Director and Curator. Brian wanted to thank MOG5 HQ for their help in the museum. Brian noted if you are willing to donate an artifact to the museum do not expect a tax receipt if you did not acquire it through official channels as it still belongs to the crown assets. It would get a museum accession number for items donated. A form would have to be filled out. Lots work done. Both Brian and Jim voiced their concern about the project, how it will be and after a year of asking for items, documents etc they are starting to show up but it is to late for some of the material to be used. It will become part of the Museum however. If interested in helping see Brian after the meeting or go visit him at the museum as he is there normally Tuesdays and Thursday 0730-1200 hrs.

Terry Chatham reminded us of the Annual Pig Roast in Groton on the first long weekend in Aug. Five hotel rooms have been booked in the same hotel as in the past at \$105 at night USD plus tax. There is going to be a remembrance ceremony a day earlier for Bear who had started the Pig Roast and this is their 30th anniversary. Bill Venator gave a talk about attending the 56th Annual Submarine Congress that was held in Belgrade, Serbia, in May. There were 200 delegates from 24 Countries who attended. Bill was the only Canadian. His talk was very informative and the next Congress will be held in Sweden in May 2020. Bill plans on attending the next Congress as well and is hoping to put together a miniature pocket book of the Dolphin Code to distribute. He hopes to get 50 copies made. He asked if SAOC(E) would be interested in contributing a small amount to help with the costs. Sylvain said slim chances but it would be discussed.

Daniel Lloyd Little thanked the members for letting him attend the meeting and thanked us all for our service. Sylvain said he has read his three books and, although fictitious, they were very entertaining and portrayed our men and women of the Submarine Service in a very good light. Buster Brown gave a small briefing with respect to the Shovel and its history. Buster thanked Brian and Jim with respect to the work being done at the Museum. Buster also gave a short briefing on the Museum and obstacles that it has had to deal with since 2011 and before. Buster then presented the Shovel and its book to Brian and Jim to be displayed in the Museum. Buster is also working on the Tot Board from the After Ends on Okanagan.
