Minutes of the Monthly Meeting
Friday 30 April 2021
Via ZOOM Conference Meeting



The Monthly Meeting of SAOC(E) was held via Zoom and combined with the SAOC(E) Weekly Zoom. This was to facilitate a presentation by the Canadian Submarine Force Group in Esquimalt which consisted of Captain Stephane Ouellet, CPO1 Patty McGuire and CPO2 Rob Tibbetts. A Zoom connection was provided for all members who wished to participate. Emails had been sent out and a posting made on Facebook Group to inform everyone. Once the connection was established greetings were extended all around. The SAOC(E) Meeting was held first before getting the brief.

Opening the Chairman, Sylvain Rouillard, brought the meeting to order (open up for dive) at about 19:15 via Zoom. With the increased cases of COVID-19 exploding in Nova Scotia this past week everyone was encouraged to do their part and follow the guidelines. Sylvain has been in contact with Mrs Gerri Brown and Buster's Funeral status. Due to COVID restrictions in Nova Scotia the Celebration of Life for Buster Brown has been cancelled until further notice. No news on Gus Gardner or Art Bodden's.

Discussion Guest Speakers attending the meeting were Captain(N) Stephane Ouellet, CPO2 Rob Tibbetts and CPO1 Paddy McGuire.

Captain Ouellet thanked SAOC(E) for letting them attend this meeting. Again, he expressed his concern with COVID. He stated that CPO1 McGuire will be taking over as Submarine Formation Chief by the middle of May. CPO2 Tibbetts will assume his role as Coxn on HMCS Corner Brook. During Captain Ouellet's last visit to the East Coast in early March 2020 the Submarine Force has changed significantly. COVID has taken its toll on the ongoing work in the Submarine Force, pushing everything to the right. Victoria has had some propulsion problems which took time to sort out and repair. Her updates make her up to date and will be a very modern and capable submarine. Windsor has done some sea trials and safety workups. She will be operating in the Halifax local area until some additional maintenance can be carried. Corner Brook work is ongoing with anticipation of sea trials in November. When she comes back in service, she will be the most modern Victoria Class Submarine in the Fleet. Chicoutimi is in a docking period and when she comes out, she will be updated as well. When she returns to the fleet, she also will be modern. The Victoria Class Modernization Project will be a series of Projects to modernize the submarines. Finally, problems still continue to the manning of all four submarines. We are experiencing some critical shortages which we are working on to overcome.

CPO1 McGuire and CPO2 Tibbetts expressed their concerns with the manning issues. The shortage of trained submariners makes it difficult to shuffle men and women around and try and get them to sea so they can qualify. Again, COVID issues makes it difficult for social distancing and to carry on work. They have been working hard to overcome any issues. It appears the issues that the Submarine Service had in the 1960's, 70's, 80's, 90's and until the end of the Oberon Class are still prevalent today but extended due to the conditions we are encountering.

It was a well-informed meeting from the Submarine Force Group and everyone appreciated it.

Around the Room Brian talked a little bit about going to the next level with respect to the Submarine Memorial or Monument. Please send any suggestions to Brian. Many obstacles to overcome. We need to form a committee, suggestions for further fund-raising events etc. Brian also mentioned that the Name Tag Project is coming along. About 210 Name Tags collected so far. Also, he continues to work on Submariners' Profiles. Jim Harris in Mexico would like to thank people who post items on Facebook. Keeps the moral up for sure. Sherm Embree talked about Battle of the Atlantic and the SS Nerissa of which his uncle was onboard. It was torpedoed on 30 April 1941 by U-552. Sherm is donating a couple of copies of the book to the Naval Museum of Halifax. Everyone is encouraged to buy the 2nd Edition. Much of the information was classified for years and it's the first recent account of the loss of life and the trials of the crew of that ship.

Adjournment There being no further business, it was moved by Jim Northrup and seconded by Jerry Brown to adjourn the meeting at 2015 hrs. **Carried**
