Minutes of the Monthly Meeting Friday 28 July 2021 at RCNA Peregrine & Via ZOOM Conference Meeting

The Monthly Meeting of SAOC(E) was held at RCNA Peregrine & via Zoom. Emails had been sent out and a posting made on Facebook Group to inform everyone that the meeting would commence at 1700 Halifax time. Upon arrival at Peregrine a connection was established so members could connect.

Opening the Chairman, Sylvain Rouillard, brought the meeting to order (open up for dive) at about 17:17. He greeted all attending members and those connected via Zoom. With the improved cases of COVID-19 and restrictions being lifted in the province it was encouraging to see so many members attend at Peregrine whom we haven't seen in many months. He thanked everyone in the Zoom meeting who connected as well.

He is continuing this task. Brian encouraged people to find out their status and pay their dues. An email was sent out a couple of days after the end of April meeting asking people to pay their dues.
