Minutes of the Monthly Meeting
Wednesday 25 May 2022 at Somme Branch Legion &
Via ZOOM Conference Meeting

He got a tour of Halifax, along the Eastern shore and over his place in Musquodoboit Harbour. A good day all round. Upon the finish of the Ceremony at the Sailors Memorial the procession proceeded to the Bonaventure Anchor Memorial, where wreaths were laid by the Lt. Government and Admiral, and we also re-laid our wreath there. People pay respects by laying poppies and wreaths.
